The Pajulahti Sports Institute area enables a great sprint competition with fast park areas and complex buildings. There are also some uphills and stairways.

Middle and long distance


Middle and long distance will also take place in Pajulahti. Forest area is big enough so both races will be run in different parts of the terrain. The area consists of large hill areas with fast and open tops and slower parts between the hills. Maximum height difference on the terrain is about 60 meters. There are also some signs of forestry.

Punching System

The EMIT-punching system will be used. EMIT-cards can be rented from the organizers by choosing this option in the entry form. Rental is $5 \notin /1$ race or $10 \notin /$ all 3 races.

Audiogram

In order to participate in the NBDOC, you must have a hearing loss of at least 55dB. NBDSF is following ICSD's and EDSO's regulations for audiograms.

Entries and registration

- Entries will be open from 14 February to 30 April 2022 to nbc2022@skul.org
- It is possible to enter for one competition only (sprint or forest competitions).
- Entries become valid only after payment of the entry fees. If you choose our special offer fees, entry fees are included. Deadline for payment is 3 July 2022.
- It is **not possible** to pay in Pajulahti. Payment needs to be made in advance.

Easy to get to Finland

It is convenient to get to Finland by flight to Helsinki Airport and by train from the airport to Pajulahti Olympic Training Center.

Journey time

From Helsinki Airport or Helsinki ferry station to Pajulahti Olympic Training Center takes around 1,5 hour by car and from Helsinki airport to Nastola railway station takes about 1,5 - 2 hours by train and from Nastola railway station to Pajulahti Olympic Training Center 4km (by taxi) or we can arrange a volunteer to pick you up at the Nastola railway station.

If you need any help arranging travel to Pajulahti, contact us (by email).

If needed, a transport service (from Nastola railway station to Pajulahti) will cost 25€/ per car (max. 4 person)



There are two options of room standards:

Sport standard rooms (twin or triple)

incl. breakfast 3 nights 150€ OR 2 nights 100€ / person half-board (breakfast + dinner) 3 nights 185€ OR 2 nights 125€ / person

Hotel standard rooms (twin or triple)

incl. breakfast 3 nights 210€ OR 2 nights 140€ / person half-board (breakfast + dinner) 3 nights 245€ OR 2 nights 165€ / person
